A. Introduction

Al-Taubah verse 100.

Personality is a characteristic, character, or characteristic within a person that originates from the formation obtained from the surrounding environment, such as family, and also what a person is born with. Personality is something that is inherent in humans as a whole and has characteristics that are different from each individual. Personality continues to develop and change even though there is a system that binds the various components of the personality, and personality is an inseparable scope of work of the body and soul in one unit.

Allah SWT glorifies Muslims when they are always in divine guidance, and among those noble characters as mentioned in Q.S. Ali-Imran: 110.

"You are the best people born for mankind, enjoining what is good, and forbidding what is evil, and believing in God. If the People of the Book believed, it would certainly be better for them, among them there are believers, and most of them are wicked people." (Fatahuddin & Hamka, 2022) Humans are the most perfect creatures created by God compared to other creatures. The Islamic conception of the essence of man as the most perfect creation is found in Surat al-Tin verse 4 which reads:

"Indeed We have created man in the best form."

Humans as the most perfect created creatures can be seen from two aspects, physical and physical. From a physical perspective, the arrangement of human body parts is an arrangement designed in such a way as to make humans perfect, for example the brain is the noblest part of the body placed in the highest position, in contrast to animals whose brains are the same as their backs. (Hakim et al., 2020) This is one proof of human perfection compared to other creatures. From a physical perspective, humans are able to think, consider and use their minds well, besides that, humans are creatures equipped with reason and passion, within humans there is good potential and bad potential, divine qualities and Syaithoniyah traits, both of these traits are still in the form of raw materials that must be processed. If the Syaithoniyah character is more dominantly developed, then a bad person will emerge, if the Divine nature is cultivated and developed then a good Muslim person will be born, who is in accordance with the demands of religion. This means that humans need education, habituation and formation to develop themselves and make them the most perfect human beings who have an essential Muslim personality.

The Al-Quran and Sunnah are two treasures of the Prophet that every Muslim must always refer to in all aspects of life. One of the most important aspects of life is the formation and development of the Muslim personality. The Muslim personality desired by the Koran and Sunnah is a pious person, a person whose attitudes, words and actions are colored by the values that come from Allah SWT. The formation of a Muslim personality is the formation of a personality that is directed at improving and developing basic (innate) factors and teaching factors (environment), guided by Islamic values. Meanwhile, teaching factors are carried out by influencing individuals through processes and efforts to create conditions that reflect life patterns that are in line with Islamic norms such as role models, advice, suggestions, rewards, habituation, punishment, and the creation of a harmonious environment.

The Muslim personality nowadays can be said to be far from Islamic norms. This can be proven by the widespread corruption among officials, the tradition of brawls among students, poor relations among the community, all of which do not reflect the personality of a Muslim. Therefore, it is necessary to study how Rasulullah SAW actually educated the early Muslim generation so that they had strong and noble personalities, namely individuals who were willing, able and willing to uphold the truth. This needs to be studied in more depth regarding the Formation of Muslim Personality from the Perspective of the Study of Islamic Education Philosophy. (R. M. Harahap, 2017)

B. Theoretical basis

1. Islamic Education

Islamic education is a continuous and comprehensive process to form individuals who are devout, knowledgeable and have noble character. (Indrawati et al., 2021) According to Syed Muhammad Naquib al-Attas in his book "Islam and Secularism", Islamic education has a goal that is more than just mastering worldly knowledge, but also includes spiritual, moral and social aspects. C. Research methods
